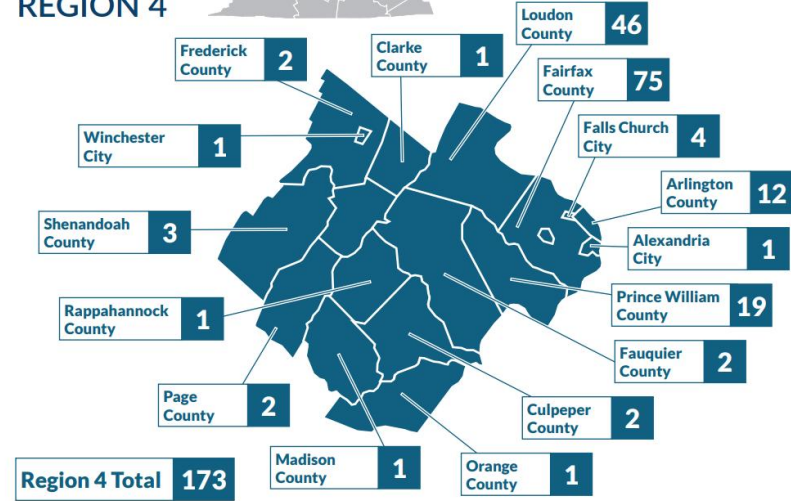

Puzzle tournament for fun coming next week.

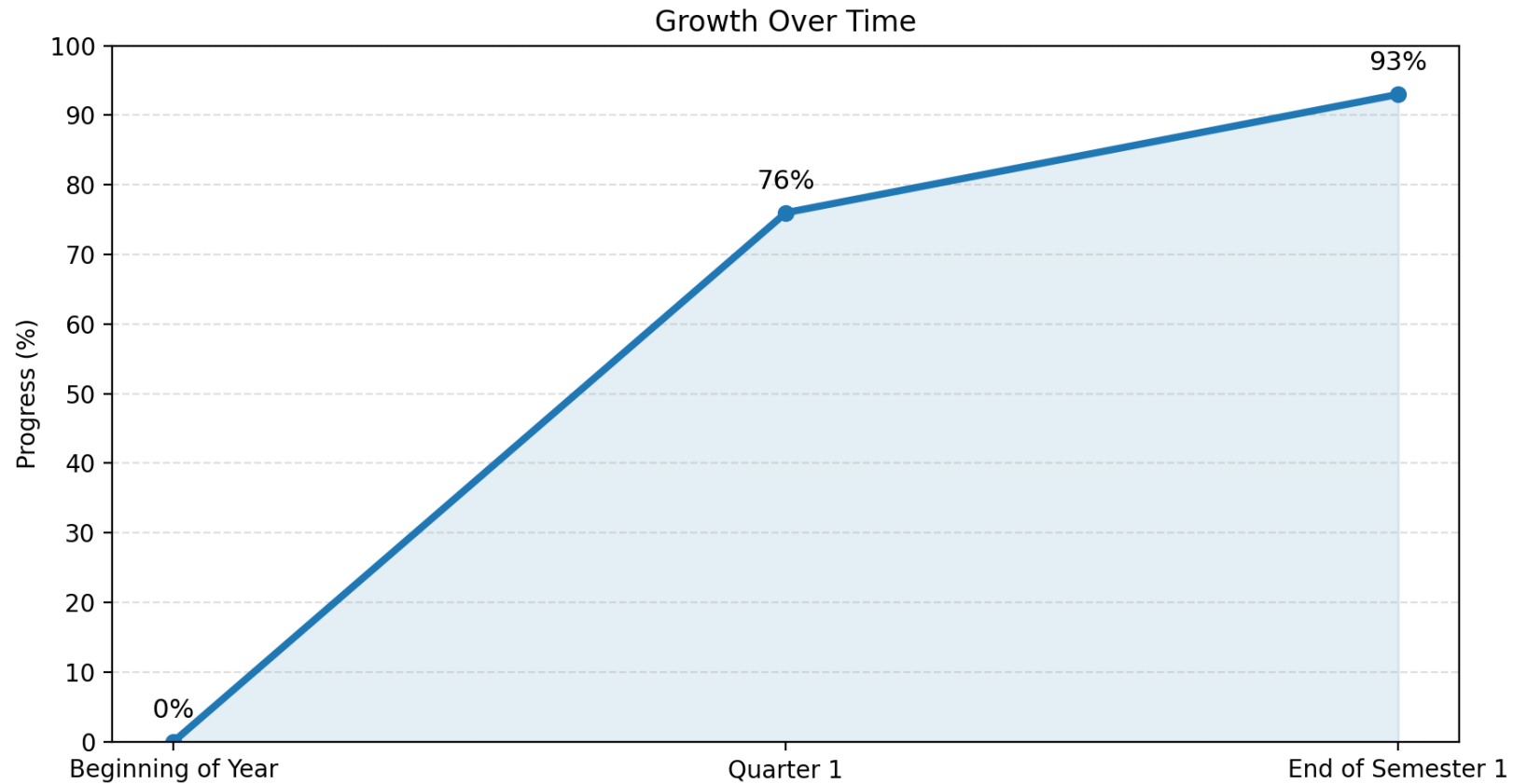
Trivia contest coming soon as well.

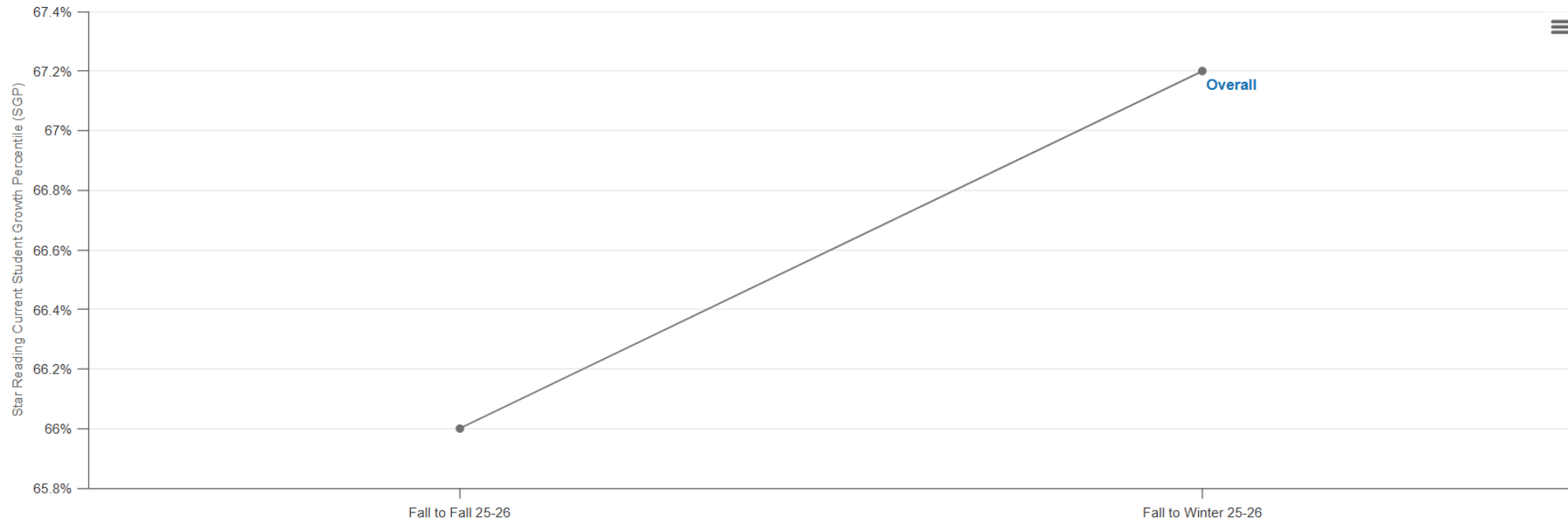

From Gifted:

First-semester attendance data for our 9th- and 10th-grade clustered PE seminars shows exceptional performance—94% and 91% respectively—far surpassing past years (mid-70s and low-60s) and standing out as outliers among other high school gifted programs, reflecting the strength of our collaboration and positioning OP as a model of excellence for the county's next gifted program plan.

10th grade gifted students for a free, behind the scenes experience at the Udvar Hazy Air and Space Center. A certified pilot instructor taught them how to fly and land a plane on FAA certified hardware. It's the same hardware/software that real pilots use for accreditation!



Testing Updates

WIDA ACCESS Testing for EL students: now until March 13th

We have worked to schedule students into smaller groups especially for the speaking portion to make them more comfortable and confident while completing the test.

Spring Writing SOL - students in English 11

March 3rd and March 4th

This is a two-day test. The first day is the multiple-choice Writing Test, where students answer questions about the mechanics of English Writing. The second day is the short essay portion of the test, on this day students compose a short essay in response to a prompt.

Students must complete both parts of the test to receive a score on this SOL.

CCRV Requirements: All College Career Ready Virginia students at NOVA must declare their intention to work towards the completion of the Uniform Certificate of General Studies (UCGS). CCRV Students must remain in good standing with NOVA's Dual Enrollment program in order to remain eligible for CCRV courses, failure to remain in good standing may result in a student no longer being eligible to be enrolled in the courses offered through this program. *Vs.12.30.25*

2. **Students must demonstrate readiness** for each college-level credit-bearing course in which they want to enroll. In demonstrating readiness, a student must meet one of the criteria established for each transfer course in which they want to be registered. See table.
3. Students must remain in **good standing at the college** to enroll.

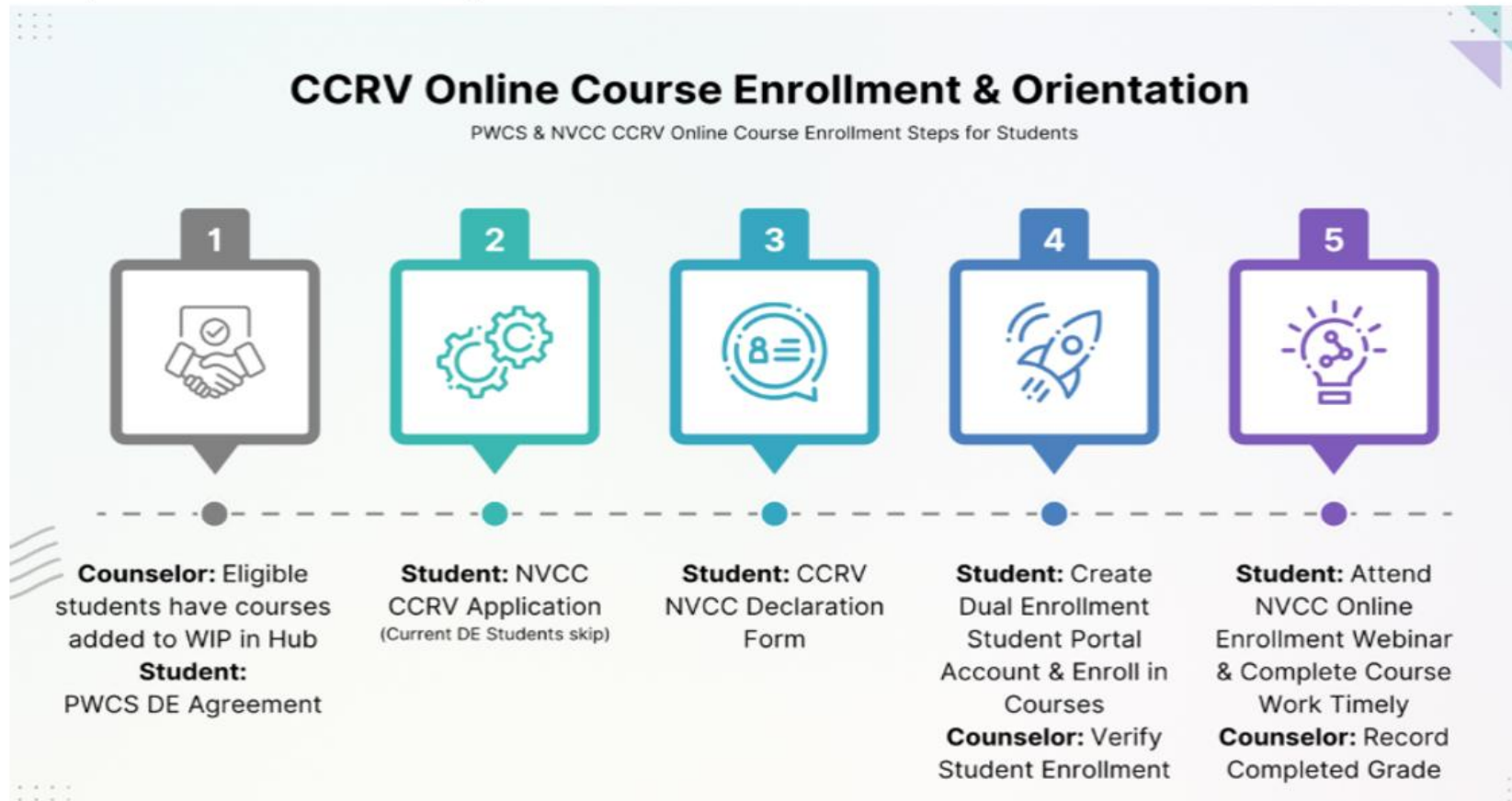
