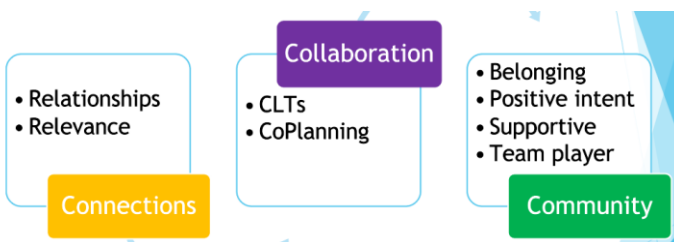

The Ready for Life 3E Framework focuses on students graduating high school ready for enrollment, employment or enlistment. School will attain points for students that meet defined expectations across enrollment (i.e., dual credit or credit bearing coursework), employment (i.e., high demand industry-recognized credentials), and enlistment (i.e., scores on a military assessment).

Schools are rated as Distinguished, On Track, Off Track or Needs Intensive Support. This is determined by the chart pictured above.

If we use last year's data to determine where OP is, we are in the On Track box. We are at approximately 85% and the on track box is between 80-89%. Our 3 big areas to grow are English, English Learner progress and Chronic Absenteeism. Our strengths based on this data are our Graduation Rate and Mathematics. OP does an outstanding job in Mathematics.

SACI Update

Ms. Berk, SACI representative, attended the first meeting of the year which was held on October 10th. The agenda was to discuss the Standards of Excellence on School Advisory Councils (PAC and SAC).

Attendees broke up into groups to discuss components of a high functioning advisory councils. They shared information with each other about their own school's PACs & SACs. Once they were brought back into a large group, the county shared their vision of what a high functioning advisory council would be. Many of the things the attendees mentioned were on that list such consistent and advertised meetings, an agenda, open discussion, parent engagement, grade level representatives (students), and cultural groups and diversity.

The second part of the meeting was orientation for new members. Ms. Berk has been a member of SACI for many years and has enjoyed serving Parkside and OP has a representative.

Their next meeting is on November 14th at which they will be discussing the State of the Schools. Our alternate representative, Ms. Mills, will attend. The topics for this meeting will be Instructional Shifts, Virginia's Literacy Act, New Standards of Learning and Assessments. Open Forum

Ms. Ramsey mentioned that the Gifted Advisory Council submitted their report to the superintendent. OP has the 2nd highest number of gifted students at 682. One concern the council has is that there are only 2 Gifted teachers at OP. The recommended ratio is 1:158 students and we are running at 1:341 students. Are there any plans to hire another gifted teacher?

Ms. Kane explained that the requirement can also be satisfied by AP classes and Dual Enrollment. Advanced course teachers also serve the gifted students who are in their classes. Our Gifted teachers do not teach classes. They provide gifted seminars.
